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1) The Beau Halo Trust – Opening Letter

Dear Healthcare Professional,

We would like to offer our sincere condolences to yourself and to your team. To lose a child, in any capacity, is truly devastating and whilst it is important to uphold professional boundaries whilst providing care, it is only natural to be left with your own feelings of loss and grief.

It is therefore imperative that bereavement advice or support is sought through your designated Bereavement Services if you yourself are left with these feelings of loss and grief.

For further support regarding what to do when a child dies please see our section 'Useful Information for Healthcare Professionals'.

It goes without saying that the loss of a child is never going to be a pleasant experience, however, there is **always** a good way to handle such an event.

The Beau Halo Trust was set up after Beau Halo Henriques unexpectedly passed away after routine (albeit complex) cardiac surgery. She was just 5 years old. After Beau's death, it became apparent that there was a lack in both local and national bereavement aftercare for parents (and their families) after a loss of a child. It was then that The Beau Halo Trust was born. The Trust supports bereaved parents and their families through the provision of services, these services include; emotional, practical and financial support.

The death of a child is often associated with lasting and intense grief and it is given that life will never be the same again for the bereaved parent(s) and their families affected. However, with support, time and nurture, families can learn to adapt and cope with their loss and their grief and this is where The Beau Halo Trust hopes to help.

We hope that you find this handbook useful and an informative source of reference for not only our work but for that of other organisations that may be beneficial in providing much needed support to bereaved parents, their families, and of course, yourselves.

2) The Beau Halo Trust – About Our Work

Background:

The Beau Halo Trust was set up after 'our' Beau unexpectedly passed away in June 2015 – she was just 5 years old.

Beau was diagnosed antenatally as having an incurable and life-limiting congenital cardiac malformation.

It was with this devastating news that our journey began.

Beau endured so much in her little life including many surgeries, medical interventions and numerous hospital stays. However, throughout all of this she remained full of life and such spirit.

In the months following Beau's passing, the lack of both local and national child bereavement services and consequential support soon became apparent, and thus, The Beau Halo Trust was born.

Who Are We?

The Beau Halo Trust is a registered Charity (Charity No. **1171777**) that currently operates within the South and South-West of England.

The Trust supports bereaved parents (and their families) through the loss of a child.



Achievements to Date:

- Through tireless fundraising from friends, family and a (very special) local business - The Beau Halo Trust achieved charity status in February 2017 as a CIO
- ✓ Our Trustees received vital Trustee training to ensure high quality CIO governance
- ✓ We held our very first charity fundraiser 'Beau beyond the looking glass' in June 2017. From this 'Alice-in-Wonderland'-inspired-ball a whopping £20,000 was raised!
- ✓ In October 2017, we held our very first talk at Southampton General educating junior doctors and nurses on the importance of bereavement aftercare
- ✓ Continual fundraising efforts ensured that the Trust can support bereaved parents and their families through the provision of financial support
- ✓ Preparations with governance, training and literature were made in time for the Trust's official launch in September 2018

Our Aims:

The Beau Halo Trust (TBHT) aims to provide a holistic approach to bereavement aftercare when a child or young person passes away with the provision of emotional, practical and financial support to bereaved parents.

The Trust also raises public awareness of the impact that child loss can have on parents, families and others.

...It's Activities:

TBHT hopes to provide **emotional** support through the provision of counselling, a volunteer-led rapid response system and closed support groups.

The Trust hopes to provide **practical** support through the provision of a comprehensive website with factsheets, general information and signposting to other relevant organisations in conjunction with the above described volunteer-led service and support groups.

Furthermore, the Trust hopes to provide **financial** support through the provision of a grant making service, granting applications for such expenses as funeral costs, short breaks and counselling.

And it's Ambitions:

TBHT hopes to increase its activities and provisions geographically to assist in the emotional, practical and financial support of bereaved parents in other areas of the South and South West of England.

Our Charitable Objects are as Follows;

To preserve and protect the physical and mental health of parents and families who have suffered a bereavement of a child or young person (under the age of 18 years) by;

· The provision of services, including; counselling, support and practical advice

• Raising awareness of the public in relation to the effect that a bereavement or loss can have on families and others

3) The Beau Halo Trust – How We Can Help

Healthcare Professionals

The Beau Halo Trust is committed to providing support to bereaved parents and their families and in turn, we are committed to helping those that provide care and support to bereaved parents and their families.

At request, we can support healthcare professionals through the provision of advancing education in relation to child loss and the impact a loss can have upon families. This can be achieved through talks, the provision of factsheets and through other materials (such as short videos).

Bereaved Parents and Their Families

The Beau Halo Trust can help bereaved parents and their families emotionally, practically and financially;

Emotionally

For grieving parents and their families hearing a friendly voice or seeing a familiar face who understands what they're going through can make all the difference. Grief isn't '9 till 5' – why should bereavement support be? Our volunteer-led helpline aims to provide bereaved parents with a listening-ear, support and practical advice when they need it most. We are here 24/7, 365 days of the year.

We also provide a volunteer-led rapid response team. This service ensures that bereaved parents and their families are supported through those very early and very often dark days. Once families have been matched with one of our fully-trained volunteers, we will endeavour to maintain this rapport as we believe that familiarity and continuity of care is key. Our volunteers can provide practical support such as advice and direction with funeral arrangements. They can also provide emotional support such as a listening-ear (and shoulder), ideas for memorial and support with bereavement aftercare.

Whether they are at the beginning of their journey or it has just been one of 'those' days – bereaved parents are not alone, we are here.

Practically

Organising a funeral for a loved one is one of the most difficult tasks endured, however, imagine organising a funeral for your cherished child. For every parent it is unthinkable. For bereaved parents, taking those next steps can seem impossible, here at The Beau Halo Trust we can offer support to help bereaved parents through the hardest journey.

The Beau Halo Trust can offer practical advice and support to bereaved parents and their families, including advice on; funeral arrangements, other resources and organisations, advice on coping day-to-day and thereafter, plus much more. Our comprehensive website contains useful information for friends and family, including ways to help and support them during their time of need. A library of downloadable factsheets (with many being written by bereaved parents) will be available and easily accessible to all.

Financially

To lose a child is truly devastating, it is a parent's worst nightmare. However, for some, this is the harsh reality and what's more, imagine having to worry about finances at such a difficult time. Whether it be funeral costs or a memorial, The Beau Halo Trust hopes to ease the burden of these unforeseen financial concerns.

The death of a child is often associated with lasting and intense grief and it is given that life will never be the same again for the bereaved parent(s) and their families affected. However, with support, time and nurture, families can learn to adapt and cope with their loss and their grief, and this is where The Beau Halo Trust hopes to help. Sometimes it is difficult to open up to loved ones about grief and trauma and sometimes an impartial party is the most appropriate method of counsel. The Trust can fund (through our grant making service) a series of counselling sessions, giving families the help and support needed to come to terms with their devastating loss. There are many ways that The Beau Halo Trust can financially assist bereaved parents and their families, so whether it be funding for counselling for bereavement aftercare or just something for the family to look forward to during the darkest of hours, we are here.

4) Useful Information for Healthcare Professionals

Even when it has been experienced personally, understanding what bereaved parents and their families are experiencing is impossible. Grief is unique and individual, it is therefore vital that support is approached with the same concept. As a healthcare professional this will usually be out of your remit but by referring or signposting bereaved parents and their families to appropriate and relevant sources of support you can ensure that if wanted, this support can be easily accessed by those who need it the most.

Some bereaved parents (and their families) may not wish to access support immediately or may not wish to access support at all – their decision must of course, be respected, but by informing them that support and future support is available if ever required is vital in ensuring that their long-term emotional needs are met.

As a healthcare professional, you will, more than likely, be first line when supporting bereaved parents and their families. Suggested action points are listed below;

	 Be kind, empathetic and understanding
	 Provide practical support through simple gestrues (such as offering a
Support	cup of tea, assistance with caring for the child's body [taking handprints for memory boxes etc.])
	 Signpost bereaved parent(s) and their families to useful organisations that are suitable to their individual needs (e.g. provide a leaflet)
Signpost	 Provide additional <u>written</u> information on 'what to do next' (e.g. registering the death, funeral arrangements etc.)
	 Provide a follow-up phone call within the immediate days following the death of a child under your care
	 Provide a follow-up phone call and/or meeting (of course, only if
Aftercare	wanted by the bereaved parent(s)) within six months following the death of a child

If you would like assistance with developing or improving upon your Child Bereavement Services, please do not hesitate to get in touch with us. Here at The Beau Halo Trust, we aim to raise awareness of the public (including that of healthcare professionals) in relation to the effect that a bereavement or loss can have on families and others.

Appendix 2

Grant Application Form – Guidance for Healthcare Professionals

Grant Selection Process – Guidance for Referrers



Eligibility for grants is as follows;

- Grant applicants must have had a child (under the age of 18) who has died within the immediate family (family includes those with legal guardianship and/or carers)
- To be eligible, the grant application must be made within 6 months from the date of when the child died
- The grant application will be considered by a panel of the board with any recommendations made to the trustee board for decision
- The grants will be considered in turn as they are presented by the grant applicants
- When the grant fund is used then <u>no</u> further applications will be considered
- Only <u>one</u> grant application per family may be made within a 6-month cycle
- The grant <u>must</u> be deemed (by the trustees) to improve the health and/or well-being and/or provide relief of stress to the grant applicant

PLEASE NOTE:

Where possible (for any amount over £500), a receipt will be needed.

If funding a service that is available from more than one supplier, the trustees may request <u>three</u> quotes.
